The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme at Saint Mary School is a two-year optional program offered during the tenth and eleventh grades. Its primary goal is to develop individuals with exceptional breadth and depth of knowledge while fostering physical, intellectual, emotional, and ethical growth. Students who complete the IB Diploma Programme will also receive their National High School Diploma, certified by the Ministry of Public Education (MEP) in accordance with current regulations.

Our students do not need to complete an additional year after the eleventh grade to obtain the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

The IB program aims to develop internationally minded individuals who recognize their shared humanity and collective responsibility to care for the planet, ultimately contributing to a better and more peaceful world.

Admission Requirements

Required Documents:

- 1. Conduct letter from the previous institution and a reference letter from the principal, psychologist, or a teacher
- 2. School transcript from the previous year, broken down quarterly or bi-monthly, certified by the previous school
- 3. Minimum conduct grade of 80 or higher
- 4. Admission assessment in Science, Mathematics, Spanish, and English (both oral and written)
- 5. Interview with DAI Department
- 6. Recent audiometric and vision tests
- 7. For foreign students: the same requirements as for primary school (see page 7)
- 8. Two passport-sized photographs
- 9. School transcript certified by the Ministry of Education (MEP)
- 10. Original and photocopy of identification document (identity card, minor identification card, birth certificate with identification number, passport)
- 11. Certification of financial status issued by the previous school
- 12. Signing of the Educational Services Contract
- 13. Completion of the Admission Form and Personal Data Permissions

Requirements to Apply for the International Baccalaureate Program:

- 1. Academic grades with a weighted average of 85% or higher from the previous year (ninth grade)
- 2. Two recommendation letters from teachers of any course from the previous grade (ninth grade)
- 3. A letter of intent expressing interest in joining the International Baccalaureate program
- 4. Interview with the Selection Panel
